ITALY {NORTHEAST}

Pinot Grigio is one of Italy's go-to whites, and the hilly terrain of districts such as Alto Adige and Veneto excel with this variety. Peach, citrus and mineral flavors define this light, crisp white, which is best served as a well-chilled sipper or as a match for roasted seafood. Veneto also turns out juicy reds made from Corvina, and rich whites such as Soave.
